10. New Matters/Any Other Business

Councillor White reported on the following items recently raised:

- Concrete blocks have been placed near Dear Farm entrance. These are actually on the land owners property.
- Trees on the footpath at the side of the Park are not DMBC and belong to the land owners (Fields in trust). DMBC have written to them to notify them of this.
- Grange Lane is to be closed for up to 5 days. Letters had been received about water being turned off. Alternative routes and directed traffic will be in place.

75th VE Celebrations were discussed for next years celebrations on 8th May 2020. Possible afternoon celebrations.

Councillor Maxwell reported on a letter received from Sally at The Burghwallis pub requesting to plant hawthorn saplings along the hedge gaps on Scorcher Hills Lane. This was agreed.

Councillor Lomas reported on the funding from the British Legion for the Remembrance band Service & Carol service, the cost was ever increasing and wanted to inform the Parish Council that within a couple of years, funding help may be requested from the Parish Council. The British Legion class this as Civilian event and don't contribute directly. All monies raised by the Poppy Appeal go to national BL funds and are not available to local branches
