

#### **Letter from Fr Richard January 2019**

#### Just around the corner...



The New Year begins for the church with the 12 days of Christmas which lead into the celebration of Epiphany on the 6<sup>th</sup> of January. The Epiphany traditionally marks the coming of the wise men

from the East with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. We give the wise men names; Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar but we don't have any evidence for this or whether there were in fact only three of them.

The magi – would have been Zoroastrian priests from Persia. They would have been the scientists and philosophers of their day. Looking into the heavens they would have interpreted any changes in the stars as having an effect upon earth. So, for them to see a bright star; which these days we think was either a planetary conjunction or an exploding star – a supernova. Would have had a greater significance than just an unusual astronomical event. And they travel to where they believe the significance is greatest: to the West; to Judea where, to their surprise, they find a child born in a stable and lain in a manger.

The gifts they bring have significance: gold symbolises kingship, frankincense is the incense used by priests, and myrrh is the sweet-smelling perfume used in anointing the dead. The symbolism of these gifts reveals the nature of Jesus as king and priest and sacrifice. The Epiphany is all about revealing the nature of Jesus as God made manifest in Man. The season goes beyond the gifts of the magi to reveal the dual nature of Jesus as both divine and human; in his baptism, in changing water into wine, and in acts of healing.

The New Year can be for all of us a time of new beginnings. We do not know what it may bring. The magi had access to all the wisdom and scholarship of their day and yet they still did not think that the Christ-child would be born homeless in a stable. They knew something special was happening but they did not know how it was all going to work out.

We do not know what the coming year will bring. My hope is that the divisions and rancour caused by the Brexit debate will find some kind of healing and that our country may be more united and at peace with itself. As we look to the future for our families and friends, we all hope for a happy and peaceful time. I know in the coming year I shall take my fair share of weddings, baptisms and funerals – all those actions of joy and sorrow that mark our lives when we turn to God. It is my hope that, in turning to God, you may discover that his face has always been turned towards you to welcome you into his presence. May God bless you and all those whom you love throughout the coming year.


#### And from Campsall 4A trust... ... a request for volunteers.

## CHURCHYARD St. HELEN'S BURGHWALLIS

The heap of soil in the corner of the churchyard has now been moved to the new site and is in the process of being levelled and the grass reinstated. Churchwardens Shirley and Colin would like to thank the Monday morning team of volunteers for their help in carrying out this work.

#### MEDIEVAL STONE CROSS

The Grade II listed stone cross located south of the porch door at St. Helen's Burghwallis has been repaired after a piece of stone broke away from the shaft last winter. The medieval square base and shaft with stopped chamfers in magnesian limestone are surmounted by a 20<sup>th</sup> Century crucifixion beneath pitched roof canopy.
