

Letter from Fr Richard March 2020

### Some Lenten Thoughts...

The Season of Lent has begun. On Ash Wednesday, Christians around the world attended church and had ash imposed on their foreheads with the words:

Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.

Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

These are solemn words indeed, calling us to remember our own mortality and how we ought to live our lives. It is a reflection of what philosophers call the *is/ought* problem. How it is possible to look at how the world is and then determine how it ought to be.

Lent is a time for us all to look honestly at our lives – how we really are – but then to consider how we would want our lives to be. What changes we might make to improve ourselves.

But change depends upon what our picture of our future self might be. In the song *Che Sera, Sera* a girl asks her mother,

When I was just a little girl
I asked my mother what will I be
Will I be pretty?
Will I be rich?
Here's what she said to me
Que sera, sera
Whatever will be will be
The future's not ours to see
Que sera, sera.

The mother's response is one of fatalism which suggests that we have no control over ourselves or our future – we are just victims of fate. But the Christian belief is that we do have the power to change our lives for the better.

The words said while imposing ashes show this different view in which we do have self-will and can make choices that affect our future. The choice offered is to turn away from sin; that is to turn away from the things that keep us from God. Then we do something positive by turning to Christ who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

It is about recognising our own mortality and the briefness of our time upon earth but then turning towards the hope of heaven seen in the life of Christ. At funerals, I often say these words:

In Jesus, God became like us so that we might be like him. He died as we die so that we may rise from death as he rose.

In turning to Christ, we turn towards a hope that raises us up out of the dust of our mortal life and holds before us the promise of life lived in God's presence.

This Lent use the time to look at your life and see what change for the better can be made. For Christians it is a time to walk with Jesus through the wilderness taking the path of self-denial. A time to learn that, when all else is stripped away, we stand in the presence of God.

# Preparing for Easter and for Confirmation

During the season of Lent Fr Chris will be leading us on a spiritual journey through the Bible as we accompany Jesus through his forty days in the wilderness. Although the inspiration for Chris' journey is Fryupdale in North Yorkshire.

Lent is a time for us to engage more closely with our faith through study, prayer and acts of self-denial. This Lenten course is an opportunity to renew your relationship with God and dig a bit deeper. At the beginning of May, we will be joining other churches of the deanery for a service of confirmation. Confirmation is a time when we return to the promises that were made for us at baptism when we were children but which we now, as adults, reaffirm in the light of our mature faith and understanding.

A slideshow presented by local historian, David Fordham. Campsall Village Hall


Admission to both events is £5 to include a prize draw ticket and tea or coffee.






