He says, "Do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows." We must hold fast to this encouragement knowing that when we are separated as we are now, God cares for each one of us. Use the time of prayer either in church or at home to feel the closeness of God. Turn to him and know that his face is always turned towards you.
