Again, this morning we hear Jesus using a farming context in his parable but this time to warn us of the opposition we face as Christians. Jesus reminds us of the time of judgement when the harvest comes and the wheat and the tares are harvested and separated – the wheat to be collected in the barn and the tares to be bundled together and thrown on the fire.
