



Letter from Fr Richard November 2020

Remembering



Who would have thought 12 months ago that, as a nation we would still be facing difficult times as we try to overcome the Coronavirus Pandemic? The past few months have taught us that we are all part of the one community; our actions as individuals affect so many other people. We have learned how to be distant in order to protect those who are closest to us. Thankfully, the NHS has done sterling work to protect us. Indeed, the NHS is the best and most long-lasting outcome of the end of the Second World War for our nation.



I always get a bit wistful in November. It marks my birthday. I shall be 65 this year, which means I shall now be older than my father was when he died. He was of that generation that took part in the second world war. I have a picture of him hung up in my office aged 19 when he was in uniform. It is just by his medals which I have had framed.



My father was a paratrooper. He landed in Normandy on the 6th of June and was captured shortly afterwards after seeing combat, spending time in Stalag IVb at Mühlberg an der Elbe. After the war he was posted to Palestine to keep the peace during the end of the British Mandate there. His return home from the Middle East was in 1947. I am sure that many of you will have family members who served in the forces then and in subsequent years. Involved both in war and in peacekeeping.

Even in these current times, when it is difficult to commemorate remembrance as we have done previously, we should not forget all those who have served this nation in times of war and of peace. This year we will also remember those who continue to serve the nation both in the health service and in the many uniformed and voluntary organisations. During lockdown we have all been asked to make

sacrifices – for most of us these sacrifices are small when compared to the sacrifices made by those whom we remember.

At the end of this month we shall begin the season of Advent. Advent marks the weeks of preparation for Christmas. In the dark winter months, we prepare ourselves for the coming of the light of Jesus at Christmas. My we pray that these dark times may soon come to an end.

If South Yorkshire remains in Tier 3 restrictions at the time of this meeting, it <u>will not take place</u>.



St Helen's Church Burghwallis



Sadly, the roof of Burghwallis Church has suffered a collapse which means that it is unsafe to open the church for public worship. As you will see from the picture the roof tiles are unstable and there is considerable danger posed to anyone standing nearby. I have therefore taken the decision to close the

churchyard to all visitors. The cremation plot has been fenced off as this the area that is most at risk.

I realise that this will be distressing news to many parishioners. Particularly those who are regular worshippers and those who visit the graves of loved ones.

St Helen's is a much loved and nationally significant building. The roof repairs are not covered by insurance and so the cost of repair will need to be met by the parish church from its resources.

Clearly, the church is likely to be closed for some time while repairs are undertaken. An initial assessment suggests that the whole roof will need to be replaced which is quite a large undertaking. In the meantime, services in the benefice – including weddings, baptisms and funerals will continue at St Mary Magdalene, Campsall. Please see the church noticeboard for details.

It is a timely reminder of the fragility of our Christian presence. The only long-term answer to maintaining an open church at Burghwallis is that it should be used regularly by the people of the parish. It is my hope that, once repairs have been done and we are able to return to normal worship then you, the people of

Burghwallis, will be able to show your support for your parish church. *Fr Richard*

Remembrance Sunday – November 8th

Restricted Commemorations

At the time of writing we are currently intending to hold Remembrance commemorations on Sunday 8th November. Clearly, we shall need to follow the national advice we are given, so it is intended that each of these commemorations will be reduced in scope to enable appropriate social distancing to take place.

In addition, I intend opening Campsall church from 10.00 am to 2.00pm on Saturday 7th November to enable individuals or small groups (no more than 6) to light a candle and spend time in their own act of remembrance and prayer.

Our current planning for the 8th is:

10.00 am Act of Remembrance – **Norton** (Please stand in socially distanced groups in the Royal Hotel Carpark)


10.20 am Act of Remembrance – **Campsall Cemetery**) (Please stand in socially distanced groups on the pavement or in the cemetery)

11.00am Service of Remembrance – **St Mary Magdalene**, **Campsall** (Inside Church following guidelines for social distancing)

1.00pm Service of Remembrance – **Burghwallis** (This will take place in the park where social distancing will be observed. Groups and individuals may then lay wreaths afterwards at the War Memorial)

All the above arrangements are subject to cancellation or change following Government guidance.

In recent weeks we have used our portable public address system and Zoom to relay services on-line to ensure that as many people as possible have been able to share in weddings and funerals.




Jesus told them, "For this reason, every scribe who has been discipled in the kingdom of heaven is like a homeowner who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old."


