## **Letter from Fr Chris**

As readers will be aware from the February edition, by the time you receive this magazine Fr Richard and Rev Ann Walton will have retired. Richard and Ann's final service was an online version on 14<sup>th</sup> February. Whilst following Covid requirements, we were able to thank Fr Richard via Zoom and give him some gifts, (see pictures), many people from the local villages, local businesses and care homes contributed towards Richard's farewell gifts, as well as the PCC's of Burghwallis & Campsall church. It really highlighted the respect and love people have for Fr Richard and the positive impact he has had on many, while serving as the Priest in Charge.

As Associate Priest of Burghwallis & Campsall churches I will continue my work as a Priest in the benefice.

Christine and I have been attending Campsall church since 2005, becoming more involved with Burghwallis church a few years later. I started my discernment towards Priesthood in 2007, finishing six years of study at Durham University. Like Fr Richard, I am a Self-Supporting Minister (SSM), which means I do not receive a payment from the church and do not live in a vicarage. Christine and I live in Norton and therefore live within the benefice, and many of you may know me from various village events. If you see us around, please say hello. I have a full-time job with the Diocese of Sheffield separate to my Priest role, which means I will have to balance the two different roles, as both can require me to work both days and evenings.

Christine was licensed as a lay reader in 2016 and accepted for Priest training in 2020, and is currently on placement until Easter at St Peters Bentley. Christine, God willing, will also become an SSM and has a full-time job as a senior manager in a local authority.


I ask everyone to pray for Christine as she continues her studies and for both of us as we get used to juggling full-time roles and our ministry work.

I would like to thank all those who have supported both churches in the last year, through messages, attendance at church (when possible), through online media and any other ways, especially our Wardens, Jenny, Christine, Shirley and Colin and the PCC members. Please can I ask that you continue to pray for us all.

2020 brought some challenges, not only the fact that Covid has prevented our usual diary of events, but also the reality that both churches have had issues with the buildings, a roof collapse at Burghwallis and lead taken from the roof at Campsall.

The result is that the finances of both churches have been significantly impacted, although we are grateful that congregation members have continued with their regular giving.

The theme for 2021 is HOSPITALITY, finding ways of being together, whether its networking at an event, getting together over a meal or just a gossip over coffee, because we all know how much we have missed the opportunities to meet others. We really do ask and pray, that when the time comes for us to open our doors again, that anyone who used to attend our churches and maybe got out of the habit, or who has never been before, comes along. ## **CENSUS 2021**

As previously mentioned in the January magazine, the once-every-10 years national census will take place this month. The census day is Sunday 21st March.

Every household will receive a request for them to participate, although there are no legal sanctions for anyone who does not do so. Historically, well over 90% of households complete the census, and it is hoped that this year there will be even greater participation as there will be the facility to complete the census on-line.

For those who do not have the ability, or confidence, to do it on-line, paper copies of the census forms can be requested when the initial notice is issued. Local support volunteers are also being recruited to help any residents who have difficulty in completing the forms, and information about how to get assistance will be provided. (At the time of going to press, we don't have any more details)

It is very important that everyone completes the census, as this will form the basis of public services in the future, including things like transport, education and health and welfare services.

We hope all residents will co-operate in this vital exercise.



Jesus was at a dinner when one quest said how good it would be to be at God's feast for His people at the end of time.



Not to be beaten last year by Covid-19! The Parish Council decided to take the bull by the horns and do things differently for our Christmas lunch.


