#### **Letter from Fr Chris June 2021**

In May we moved through Eastertime towards the wonderful day of Pentecost, when the disciples received the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit has been in danger 'of becoming the soppy one of the Trinity', according to author Jane Williams, as the person of the Trinity that does not challenge others, in the way that Jesus did.

However, the Holy Spirit gives spectacular gifts, adding a distinct touch of excitement to what can otherwise become dreary religious lives. The Holy Spirit can be described as the 'comforter'. The Spirit is very politically correct and not at all gender specific.

Sometimes when the Spirit comes, it is last minute, when you just let something happen or you decide to do something unexpectedly. These 'spur of the moment' decisions often work best, giving lasting memories, when you look back and say, "remember when we suddenly went and...". I suggest that when you look at the Holy Spirit in such a way, we find that it certainly is an acceptable face of the Trinity and is far from soppy.

In June we will have more chance to meet with others, we will start preparing for weddings in church, with attendee numbers increasing. This will be an exciting time but also a nervous time for many. However, the Holy Spirit knows how to interpret the anguish of the world.

Jane Williams suggests that the work of the Holy Spirit has allowed the image of Jesus to be formed more and more clearly in so many people, such that in the midst of our cries we can hear the words 'It's all right. Keep hoping, keep working'. Hope is one of the hallmarks of the Holy Spirit and something we all need. We acknowledge on Trinity Sunday our Christian belief of one God in three persons, and the foundation for the belief that God is love.

This 'love' of God is not an abstract quality, unrecognisable to the marks of what we humans would recognise as love. It is personal, dynamic, creative, it is full of generosity, it longs for the rest of the world to see the loveliness of the beloved. The Sundays in June are part of the church calendar called 'Ordinary Time'. This June will be far from ordinary, it could be extraordinary as we come out of lockdown.

We have spent months reflecting on life, on what we have missed, and on those things we have to thank God for, as well as things we have learnt about ourselves and the surprises we didn't know about in others. The Holy Spirit has certainly been at work throughout lockdown, with many positives coming out of difficult times, many villagers supporting others, giving to charities and a thankfulness to God for what we have.

May we find June, a month where we let the Holy Spirit guide us, may love be in our hearts and may we be quick to forgive others. You never know you might even be drawn to church. St Mary Magdalene, Sundays 11am, if you are, you are very welcome to join us.

#### **GREAT BRITISH SPRING CLEAN**

This now annual event is taking place this year from 28th May to 13th June. On top of our regular on-going efforts at keeping our lanes clear of rubbish, we are organising a mass litter pick on Wednesday, 2nd June, starting at 10 o'clock. If we get sufficient numbers, we aim to blitz The Abbe's Walk, Burghwallis Lane, Burghwallis Road, and Grange Lane, but to achieve this we need all the help we can get. Volunteers will be split up into small groups in order to comply with the social distancing recommendations in place.

If you are able to spare a couple of hours to join us, we would be delighted. You can let us know by contacting Brenda Grimes in advance on 01302 727186, who will register your interest and ascertain if you need any of the essential supplies for this job, i.e. litter pickers, gloves, hi-vis vests, and black sacks. This will ensure that we have plenty of them in time for the big day. All accumulated piles of rubbish will be reported to DMBC who will then arrange to come out and collect them within 24 hours.

In the meantime, either before that date, or indeed afterwards, if anyone wishes to "do their own thing" in collecting rubbish, please feel free to do so. Again, contact Brenda if you need any supplies, and then either report the results of your efforts to her, or directly to DMBC.

The oxen stumbled, and Uzzah thought the Ark might fall off the cart.










So he left the Ark stored at the house of Obed Edom.
