

Letter from Fr Chris

We move through July, a period the church calls 'ordinary time' and is part of the weeks following Trinity Sunday.

At the start of July, we are reading 2 Corinthians 12.2-10. Where we find the apostle Paul discussing his encounter with God on the road to Damascus. It was 3 years after his experience that he started to minister to the Gentiles. In this part of the letter to the Corinthians we hear the inhabitants, who appear to love a spectacle are talking about 'super apostles', who have, presumably, been pandering to their love of spectacle. It takes Paul patience to explain that the aim of an apostle is not to gather crowds of admiring followers who gasp at his spiritual prowess. Paul's witness is to Christ only. The same is true within our local churches, I do not wear a cape, I am not super in any way. If fact I welcome being ordinary, we do not wish for people to attend St Mary Magdalene or St Helen's (when reopened), to see and hear spiritual prowess, far from it. You are all welcome to hear a local vicar, more Yorkshire prowess.

On 22nd July we have our Patronal day for St Mary Magdalene. In each of the gospels Mary Magdalene is listed as one of the women who walked to the tomb early on Sunday morning. Only in John, however, is Mary identified as the only woman who went to the tomb. Mary woke early in the morning to walk to the tomb. She needed to make this trip as an expression of her grief, and in order to complete the burial preparations of the body. I think Mary also simply wanted to spend time with the person she loved. Mary went to the tomb early in the morning because of love. Her presence wasn't dictated by religious necessity or ritual. Jesus had cast out seven demons from Mary. He had transformed her life. Jesus had loved her when she was thought to be unlovable. Mary responded to Jesus' love with love. Love motivated her early morning discipline and opened her up to the possibility of seeing Jesus. Following Mary's example, people schedule specific times in their lives to be with Jesus. These times may be early in the morning, late at night, or in the middle of the day. Whenever they occur, these are times of prayer, devotional reading and meditation—times to be with Jesus.

Near the end of July we celebrate another apostle, that of James, who's older brother John was also an apostle to Jesus. The brothers nicknamed "the sons of thunder", must have either argued often between themselves or were very noisy. It reminds us of the humanity within our apostles. In the Gospel of Matthew 20:20 we hear James's mother asking Jesus if James and his brother John can sit at the left and righthand in his kingdom. Jesus answered 'You do not know what you are asking'. Jesus said to them 'Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?'. This passage always reminds me that if the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, then I should always do the same. Jesus gave his life to ransom many.

Within July we have read about two apostles, first from Paul, a self-supporting minister, a ministry that is unpaid. Which, incidentally, is same ministry as I hold. Paul highlights the importance of our witness to Christ. Then James, a 'son of thunder' who lived a long life spreading the word of the Lord. Then our Saint St Mary Magdalene showing in her actions the importance of Love.

I wish all of you a happy and relaxing July, with our thoughts on Family, Love and our Lord.





Campsall 4a Trust

Like most people these days, we at Campsall 4aTrust are looking forward to getting back to normal by re-opening our activities. In normal times, we run two term-time parent and toddler groups, Monday mornings at Norton Community Hall and Friday mornings in Campsall Village Hall. Volunteers have been working through both wellequipped toy stores over the last few weeks, making sure everything is washed and sanitized ready to re-open.

At the moment we only have one play-leader available, but a member of the 4a Trust will step in to fill the gap when we do re-open these groups.

With the extension of restrictions, it is most likely that we'll open up for toddlers and one carer per family group for drop-in sessions for the last two weeks of term. This will enable us to record the full details of each child and adult, as required by Covid regulations. Once plans are confirmed, we will display the details on notice boards and on social media.

Good news for members of Campsall 4a Trust Lunch club is that we're planning to start up again in August, to some extent 'under new management' although the faces will be familiar.

We've been in touch with Public Health and Trading Standards at DMBC, and having asked many relevant questions they are happy for us to re-start our activities. Social distancing will still be in place, so between now and August Trust members will spend some time in the hall plotting how to arrange the tables.

As before, attendances are limited to 26.
