Letter from Fr Chris

The first Sunday in August we continue with Gospel of John. This week there is a very revealing set of questions and answers given between Jesus and the people who have been following him around. It tells us a lot about what the people thought they were looking for in Jesus, and this gives us one of Jesus's own central definitions of his work.

There is a theme of food, which is not surprising, following the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand. For some, not having to worry about where the next meal is coming from would be a miracle. The Benefice of St Helen's Burghwallis and St Mary Magdalene Campsall are both looking into the future, especially focusing on 'hospitality'. This can happen in many ways, offering our churches to local groups to meet in and also to be inviting when people visit.

Two aims is to talk with local groups to see if our building can support retired people to meet and just have a drink and a chat and for a future aim of opening a Dementia Café. Anyone interested in either of these areas of mission, please contact me. We are looking at purchasing coffee machines etc and creating space to have time to sit and talk, have a drink and get to know each other in church and with villagers, who are always welcome. Ensuring we remember that our churches are here to serve the community in which they are found.

The Benefice is now beginning to work closer with St Peter's church in Askern, creating a Mission area together. Both congregations are supporting the food bank at St Peter's, which covers the area. We would appreciate those who wish to contribute to drop donations off at St Mary Magdalene church. If you are unable to do this, give me a ring and I will come and pick up food stocks. Please ensure any gifts are not fresh items, as canned produce lasts longer.

Within August we look further into the Chapter 6 in the Gospel in John. The theme of hospitality and food continues when Jesus declares 'I am the bread of life'. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

If you've recently prayed the Lord's Prayer, then you made the request to your Father in heaven that He would give you this day "your daily bread."

I wonder if that's a petition we make with a lot of sincerity, especially for many of us who are financially stable. Are we really concerned about getting what we need to maintain our bodies? Is there any doubt at all that there will be food on our tables tomorrow? It's hard to pray this when the shelves in our pantry hardly have room for more, when we have a freezer (or maybe two freezers) full of meat, and the supermarket is just down the road.

But even if we've never prayed this petition with a growling stomach and an anxious heart, it is a prayer to offer—to pray every day. For it is built on the foundation of God's sure promise that He'll provide us with all we need, for as long as He gives life. Through teaching us to pray, our gracious Father seeks to instill in us a daily reliance on his goodness.

Those who go to God through Christ will never walk away hungry. Those who draw near to God with their whole heart will never walk away, disappointed. Because for us, our faithful Saviour will always provide enough—more than enough. Amen.

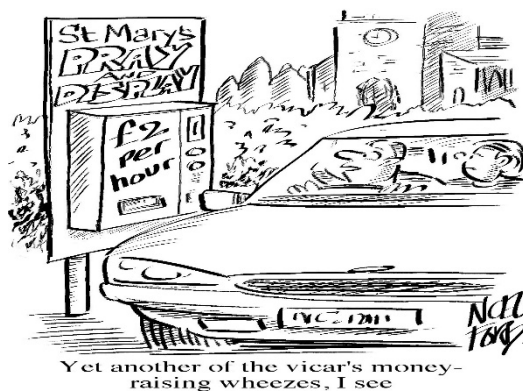

Elijah and Moses were handing on the baton, if you like.

Now God's dwelling with mankind would depend on the New Covenant based on Jesus' death on the cross.
