

Letter from Fr Chris

As we move into October we hear from disciple Mark and the book of Hebrews. October always reminds me of Harvest time and how we used to celebrate at church. As I grew up in a village near Beverley, harvest was so important - so much work to do and much celebration when the harvest was brought in. The service at church was always one of the most attended of the year.

To celebrate and to continue the tradition for a great harvest, or on some occasions to pray for a better harvest the year after. Our benefice of churches are praying for a good harvest, St Helen's Burghwallis are praying for a better harvest in 2022, with the roof still awaiting repair and the hope that the village of Burghwallis will come out and celebrate once the church is up and running again. For St Mary Magdalene Campsall, they have enjoyed a resurgence of people attending and we pray that this continues as we reach out into the community. It has also been great seeing our brothers and sisters from St Helen's joining the services and this has been a prayerful time together.

However, it is still harvesting time and many farms around us know there is still lots to do before a little rest is in order. We also have a Harvest Festival service at St Mary Magdalene at 11am on 10th October. I pray you will join us either in church or on Facebook live. We as a church also pray for a good harvest, meeting new people and bringing people into the kingdom of God.

Our readings from Hebrews at this time of year are sobering and remind us about what God is trying to do. We hear a reminder to those reading scripture to 'Today if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts' (Heb. 3.7,13,15; 4.7) Taken originally from Psalm 95, it is clearly talking about the years of whining in the wilderness. It gives an underlying warning – that it is possible to see the wonderful works of God, and yet not really believe in them as saving. Jane Williams asks us two questions -How could the people whom God had liberated ever forget the parting of the waters, the pillar of cloud, and of the fire, the water and the manna? How could they ever believe those were just passing phases in God's mercy, and convince themselves that God had lost interest and gone off and left them?

Church congregations at Harvest services has been getting less and less each year, which may resonate with the stories of our foolish ancestors, and perhaps means hearts were turned inwards. However, the events of this year have meant we have reflected on the importance of life and God. Now our eyes have turned outwards, to reach out with love into our communities, not being afraid to ask for help and support.

Plans continue for a Messy Church for younger children, which will be on a Saturday morning at Norton Community Hall, with craft activities, bible stories, FUN and FOOD. A wonderful opportunity to nurture and grow our next generation, encouraging love for others underpinned with Christian principles.

There are also opportunities for adults; everyone is welcome at church, and we will also be opening up home groups for those who prefer to talk and learn more about God and his plans for us in a small group situation. Then for the older generation, you know, those like an old wine that we love(!), we would like to open our doors for a 'Natter Church' – a place to meet with others for a chat and a cuppa! We also want to open our arms to any groups who need a space to meet, supporting our community. As I say every month, If anyone feels they can help with any of these, please ring me for a chat. If I don't answer immediately, leave a message and I will get back to you, as I work full-time as a trainer.

We welcome everyone, all ages, we welcome those who have never been to church. Help us to grow in love, and let us plant the seeds for a continuing Christian presence in our villages now and in the generations to come. Amen.


