

Letter from Fr Chris

Before the Christmas period, we have the 4 weeks of Advent, a time of reflection. A time when we all need to stop and reflect on the last year and probably the last two years. Many of us, including myself, will be looking back on this time with sadness for the losses we have suffered, but also with thanks for all those people came forward to help others. The start of December brings us to Luke 3 1-6 and John the Baptist, a man who spoke out against the establishment and told the people that someone was coming who would change the world. John shouts out the words from the prophet Isaiah. "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." John the Baptist is the messenger; he knows who is coming, but probably doesn't know what will happen. The message is to come in the person of Jesus Christ. Many people then struggled to recognise God, just as they do today, because they tried to make him fit into their expectations rather than God's plan.

Advent is a time of peace and reflection, although for many it is more a time to get decorations and lights up, a time to order food and presents, a time to rush around organising and a time to get stressed, as we try to find all the luxury items we wish to give to others and to drink or eat ourselves. I urge you all to stop and think of those who do not have as much as you. We are collecting chocolate for the Askern 'Cry' foodbank. Our mission link is with St Peter's Askern, and I ask, if you can afford chocolate for yourself, please purchase one extra Christmas children's treat. If you can drop them off at St Mary Magdalene church on a Thursday evening or Sundays before or after the service, or at my house, it will be wonderful to thank you, but more importantly it will give a child an additional surprise that they would not otherwise get. A little luxury for the young in society. John was a messenger of one who was to come. Jesus came and said that we should love one another as He has loved us. Please reflect on how we can all do this in our local villages.

May I continue to encourage you, especially those who are retired, if you feel you could support other retired people in fellowship, in a safe space, just to meet and chat, we are offering St Mary Magdalene to new community groups. The aim in 2022 is to create an area for people to meet, to purchase coffee machines etc, and to reach out to those who would like to make use of the space. Can you help? From a small seed a community project can grow.

Christmas services: Carol Service 4pm 12th December, Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve and a Service on Christmas Day morning at 9.30am. Our Christingle service 4pm Christmas eve, will not be held in church, but will again be live via Facebook and recorded. This year more church members are involved and there is a new member to our Christingle team who will be introducing themselves. As last year, we will have Christingle bag pick up points around the villages, which will be publicised on our Church Facebook pages closer to the Christingle event.

I pray this month we all have time to reflect, and I pray especially for families with young children trying to make ends meet, for those one their own and for those who struggle at this time of year. I encourage you to come to church, come for a chat. Or if you wish me to pray for you, please let me know.

They reached Jerusalem, the home of king Herod.




The Romans had made Herod king of the Jews about 30 years earlier.

Micah 5:2


Herod secretly met the wise men and asked when they had first seen the star.

THOMAS TROOP OUR LOCAL CENTURIAN +2



Congratulations to Tom who celebrated his 102nd birthday November 8th 2021.

He was born in 1919 on the day the Spanish flu epidemic was officially declared over. Tom was Christened in Burghwallis Church and lived the majority of his life in Norton. He has farmed the land all around this area since horses were the main power of farming. During WW2 he was a member of the AFS (Auxillary Fire Service) which was situated behind the Royal Hotel).

He married Rose in 1943 in Campsall Church celebrating their 78th wedding anniversary this year. (This must be nearing a record!).

Campsall Church has been the centre of Toms Christian life, being part of the choir, the PCC, and Church Warden for many years. Tom has many stories of his life within the church, one he is particularly proud of is in the mid 1950's the moving of an Alter from Hardwick Hall Estate Chapel, to Campsall Church. The alter was offered to Campsall Church when Hardwick hall chapel was closed, though it was thought that it would be impossible to move without damage. Tom thought differently, so with great trepidation from the PCC, Tom with his son Alan, George Hope, and a few choir members, took the farm lorry and brought the Alter to Campsall without a scratch. This Pugin Alter now sits very proudly in the Lady Chapel and admired by all. Hopefully we can bring you more stories from Tom as he celebrates his 103rd Birthday!
