Letter from Fr Chris



Doesn't time fly when you are enjoying yourself. It has been a year since I took over writing a monthly introduction to our monthly magazine. To be honest it does not feel a year and time passes us by so quickly.

As we move into February 2022, we listen to the Gospel of Luke, Luke brings us woe's as well as blessings, Luke 6:17-26 is a passage about where to put your trust. Reminding those who having nothing else in life to trust in, and to have to fall back on God. When times are difficult and 2021 has been no different to 2020. It times of pain and heartache many, Christian and non Christian have found themselves praying. Those that fall back on God are the ones who are blessed, Luke tells us. The rest of us have had our blessing from what we chose to put our trust in.

Trust is such an important word. For me, working for the Diocese of Sheffield and National Safeguarding team for the Church of England, it is a powerful if you can trust. Trust is described as 'a firm belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone or something'. As you will understand I am cautious in who I trust, except God, who I trust with everything.

A number of things have changed over the last year, for better and worse. For my church roles I have to follow the charity commission and Church of England regulations. Which has meant we no longer charge for the magazine in Campsall, as we used to. The requirements to receipt money and have ledgers would be time consuming and we do not have the numbers in church as when the magazine first started. Therefore, we send it to you as a gift. If you do wish to give a donation to the church that is fine and those that do, I thank you.

Another change is not being able to put information about people within the magazine, such as deaths and marriages without the written agreement of the family, due to new GDPR regulations.

Luke continues into February with Luke 6:27-38 moving away from the blessing and woes section to a passage about 'now'. Jesus says If you want a blessing, rather than woes, this is what you have to do'.

So, what has happened that we can call a blessing.

Well, Campsall Church has been having services and all are welcome, we have introduced and all age service the first Sunday of each month.



Other blessings are:

On 4th December 2021 we started our Messy Church for children & parents at the Norton Community Hall, at 11am each month on the Saturday before the all age service at Campsall.

Any parents & children interested please contact us.



We have started a home group in Norton for those wishing to look deeper into scripture and Christian life, but in a more hospitality theme in homes, not church. If anyone is

interested in starting such a group in Campsall, Sutton or Burghwallis please let me know and we can discuss further and support/train you further.

We are restarting our bible study group for those moving into their Golden Age, with a little more bible knowledge, who wish to look deeper into scripture and some of the less known books.



More blessings for St Helen's Burghwallis as the faculty for the agreement for the roof repairs soon to be finalised. Hopefully this will mean contractors will soon be onsite to repair the roof.

Plus, environmentally, both churches are

now registered with arocha and are starting to work towards their bronze awards, with the help of two experience volunteers. This will include the starting of a 'Messy Church Wild' group later in the year, for children with their parents who wish to learn more about nature and wildlife, with the aim to develop our churchyards and beyond. Any children with their parent who are able to support and lead, if you are interested please let me know. Our hope by the end of 2022 is to link up with St Peter's Askern to create a Mission area Messy Church Wild group.

We will be developing hospitality further in 2022, with a few small changes in the church, to welcome people with a drink before and after services, maybe even a bit of toast etc. As it would be lovely to get to know more of you and learn what the church can do for you.

We also still have eyes for both churches to be more community focused and central to our communities. May I ask you for ideas of how we can do this. We can and will offer God's churches for community projects and support groups,


