

Letter from Fr Chris

I am extremely saddened that the tension in the Ukraine has turned into a full scale war. There are many of you who will remember some of the wars that the United Kingdom have been involved and the loss and scars war causes. I am the padre for the British Legion in Burghwallis and additionally I have trained the Senior Chaplains of the armed services in safeguarding. In both these roles I have heard many stories of bravery, near misses, loss and injury. But I have never heard a service man wish war over peace.

An expanding war in Europe is concerning, with the possibilities the war could spill over into nearby countries, including those who are members of NATO. Which brings additional complications.

The Bishop of Sheffield wrote this week:

'In the face of the appalling suffering inflicted on innocent civilians, prayer is our first responsibility, but not our last'.

Many of you, individually and as church communities, will already have found agencies through which to channel your financial and other aid.

But you might like to be aware of the appeal launched last Friday by the Diocese in Europe in partnership with USPG (United Society Partners in the Gospel).

Funds raised will support humanitarian work both in Ukraine (where there is an Anglican chaplaincy in Kyiv) and with refugees fleeing into neighbouring countries.

The appeal will provide critical help in meeting the immediate needs of people still in Ukraine and of those who have fled, as well as supporting the longer-term work of recovery, when peace is restored.

On 16th April 2022, Easter Saturday, we have a Coffee Morning 10am to 12pm. All money raised will be given to support Ukrainian refugees.

A prayer for the Ukraine:

God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine today. We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons. We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons. We pray for all those who fear for tomorrow that your Spirit of comfort would draw near to them. We pray for those with power over war or peace, for wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide their decisions. Above all, we pray for all your precious children, at risk and in fear, that you would hold and protect them. We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace. **Amen**.

We have wonderful news that St Helen's Church Burghwallis has now completed the faculty process for the roof repairs needed to allow the church services to restart.

Hopefully this will mean contractors will soon be onsite to repair the roof.

If you live in the village, I would ask you to take the plunge and come to a service and meet others. We are a small group of people, who, upon reflection cannot keep going without the support of the village, we would love to link up with others, to see how the church can be more central to the village and events. Otherwise, the church that has stood for over 1,000 years, will become yet another monument.





Both Burghwallis and Campsall churches are now registered with A Rocha and we are making good progress towards their bronze awards, with the help of two experience volunteers and the support of the probation service.

This will include the starting of a 'Messy Church Goes Wild' group later in the year, for children with their parents who wish to learn more about nature and wildlife, with the aim to develop our churchyards and beyond. Our hope during 2022 is to link up with St Peter's Askern to create a Mission area Messy Church Goes Wild group. Any children with their parent/s who are able to support and lead, if you are interested, please let me know.

We will be developing hospitality further in 2022, with a few small changes in St Mary Magdalene church, to welcome people with a drink before and after services, maybe even a bit of toast etc. As it would be lovely to get to know more of you and learn what the church can do for you.

We also still have eyes for both churches to be more community focused and central to our communities. May I ask you for ideas of how we can do this. We can and will offer God's churches for community projects and support groups.

We especially wish to look at opening the following:

A Natter Church, a place for people of retirement age to have a chat together in church

Dementia Café, to support both those with Dementia and their supporters.


There is a £1 charge per child, to help pay costs such as tea and coffee for adults and a sit-down snack for children.

Campsall 4 A Trust obtained National Lottery funding for the sessions before the first Covid lockdown. Due to the pandemic, the National Lottery is allowing beneficiaries to use up the unspent remainder of that grant, awarded from January 2020. The treasurer hopes to make the money stretch until the end of the summer term.

Since Christmas, we've bought a large number of new toys and pieces of equipment using the funding assigned for the purpose. The remainder goes on wages and venue hire.

Currently, the provision is due to end in July. Campsall 4aTrust would welcome new members willing to take on the administrative work involved in applying for and managing the funding.




