Letter from Fr Chris

The month of June this year will be so memorable for many of us. I head towards the extended Queens Jubilee weekend; we start with a wedding at Campsall Church. We then have Messy Church on the Saturday, I expect many golden crowns and celebrations will be had by the children. Then I will enjoy visiting many of the events happening through the area. So much going on, so much excitement.

This joy comes together in our church services on the Sunday, celebrating the Queens jubilee, as the head of the Church of England and celebrating the Pentecost. Jesus, before ascending to heaven, instructed the apostles to go to Jerusalem and wait for the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit came upon the apostles just as Jesus had promised. The Spirit gave these uneducated men the miraculous power to speak in languages that they had never learned or spoken before (speak in tongues). Because of this all the crowds of Jewish pilgrims from many countries were able to hear about Jesus in their own languages. After Peter preached the first "gospel sermon," 3000 people were baptized. Therefore, the first weekend celebrates the Queens Jubilee and the "birthday" of the church.

Then, at the end of the month with the ordination of Christine Herbert at Sheffield Cathedral. I personally cannot think of a better way to finish an exceptional month. Christine will be licenced to St Mary's Sprotborough to continue her training. This is bittersweet, as I and the churches are so proud, yet will miss her kindness, loving and steadying influence. We watched a video of the story and had a dance to sunshine songs. The vicar even tried to breakdance, but he got stuck.



We created a collage of Paul's journey, with horses, camels, houses, and sand dunes. We then made Sunshine (bright light) biscuits, which were eaten as soon as the story had been told.

We finished as always, with children sat with parents for a family buffet. With lovely sandwiches, quiche, buns and drinks.



We are happy to announce the start of Campsall bell ringing practice weekly sessions on Monday evenings at St Mary Magdalene Church.



love to link up with others, to see how the church can be more central to the village and events. Otherwise, the church that has stood for over 1,000 years, will become yet another monument.



Both Burghwallis and Campsall churches are now registered with A Rocha and we are making good progress towards their bronze awards, with the help of two experience volunteers and the support of the probation service.




Burghwallis Parish Council Meeting

A TASTY CHICKEN RECIPE FOR A SUMMERS EVENING

Chicken in Cider with Apples

4 chicken portions

1oz. butter

1 medium onion (sliced)

1 medium dessert apple (peeled, cored and sliced)


1 tablespoon flour

1/4 pint dry cider

1/4 pint chicken stock

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

2 tablespoons double cream



- 2. Fry onion and apple until golden brown then add these to chicken.
- Add stock and cider to pan and bring to the boil. Pour over the chicken, season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Cover casserole and cook in pre-heated oven Gas Mark 4, (180°C, 350°F) for about 40 minutes.
- 5. Remove chicken pieces to a serving dish and keep warm.
- 6. Liquidise the sauce, transfer to a saucepan and thicken with flour mixed to a paste with a little water. Stir until sauce thickens, remove from the heat and add cream.
- Pour sauce over chicken and serve with a selection of seasonal vegetables.
