

### Letter from Fr Chris The month of July

Christine, having now been ordained Deacon at a ceremony at Sheffield Cathedral at the end of June has now moved from St Mary Magdalene Campsall and. I am excited to announce Christine is now a Deacon at St Mary's Sprotbrough.

It will feel strange not going to the same church together, but it will also be an exciting time. On the one hand we loose a church leader in our benefice, but on the other hand, Sprotbrough gains a Deacon.

If anyone wishes to support a community drop in, on a day which doesn't clash with any other similar community groups please let me know, we aim to add to services already available, or offer a space to those who need it.

**Dementia Café**, we are praying for the opportunity to support, both those living with Dementia and their supporters. **Anyone** who has knowledge of such groups who would give advice, lead, co-lead, support please contact me personally, or leave a message on my answer phone.

## **'VILLAGE NEWS' BURGHWALLIS**Scout event in Squirrel Wood

The local scouts are holding their district camp Bungle-ee event in Squirrel Wood on the weekend of  $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$  July 2022 and we have received the following information.

"Young people will be arriving on Friday between 5:30 and 7pm. Parents have been instructed to access the Wood via A19 and The Abbe's Walk, they will then turn into the Wood. We hope to have enough adults/leaders on hand so that traffic does not queue out of the Wood gates, but if it does it will only be for a short period of time. Parents leaving have been instructed to leave via the village, using Burghwallis Lane back to the A19, or whichever route best suits them.

Saturday morning will see a small number of day visitors arrive between 8:30 and 9:30am but we should be able to accommodate these numbers within the Wood.

Sunday is the only potential busy/hectic period. The event finishes at 3pm. To try and reduce congestion we have three staggered departure times 3pm, 4pm and 5pm. We hope to have most people off site by 6pm.

Parents collecting young people will follow the same traffic flow as Friday; and again we will do out best to keep The Abbe's Walk clear. We know a few local residents who walk their dogs through Squirrel Wood. Could you please pass on our request for them not to do this during that weekend?

Hopefully we will keep disruption to a minimum and you may only hear a bit of music and plenty of fun and laughter coming from the Wood. For many young people, and adults, it will be their first time camping in nearly 3 years."


### **CRY FOOD BANK**

At this difficult time for every household let us not forget the needy and those who already depend on the food banks to put food on their tables.





#### THIS RECEIPE SOUNDS FUN FOR FR CHRIS TO TRY!

Iman Bayildi "The Priest has Fainted"

2 large aubergines Salt 4fl. oz. olive oil

2 onions (finely chopped)

2 cloves garlic (crushed)

9oz. tomatoes (skinned and chopped)

1/2 teaspoon mixed spice

Juice of ½ lemon

1 teaspoon brown sugar

1 tablespoon chopped parsley

1 tablespoon pine kernels

Salt and pepper

- 1. Halve the aubergines, scoop out the flesh, leaving a substantial shell. Sprinkle shells with a little salt and leave upside down on a plate for 30 minutes to drain.
- Heat half the oil and fry the onion and garlic until just soft. Add scooped out aubergine flesh, tomatoes, mixed spice, lemon juice, sugar, parsley, pine kernels and a little seasoning.
- 3. Simmer for about 20 minutes until thickened.
- 4. Wash and dry the shells and fill with mixture. Place in a buttered ovenproof dish.
- 5. Mix the remaining oil with ¼ pint water and a little seasoning. Pour around the shells and bake at 180°C for 30-40 minutes.

Serve hot or cold garnished with fresh herbs and accompanied by lemon wedges and wholemeal bread.

So they walked back to Jerusalem and started searching for Jesus...




