



Letter from Fr Chris The month of August

As I am writing this, we have just had the hottest day ever recorded. I don't know about yourselves, but I found it difficult, and it was a reminder of our commitment to ensure we do not destroy the Earth, through our miss management of resources. The Church of England's fifth mark of mission "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth". We must ensure that, as Christian's, we try to be as environmental as we can. We are finalising plans for Messy Church "Goes Wild", with St Peters Askern and hopefully we can start a Mission Area in September to teach children more about our environment.

In August Jesus asks us to be watchful, a reminder that Jesus could be here today and the need to remember the other four marks of mission.

The first mark of mission is "To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom, we need to remember, attending church is only a small part of what Jesus wants us to do. Jesus sent his disciples and the 72 out to talk to people, to celebrate the good news of Jesus. When we are talking to others, mention you go to church, or used to attend church and that you pray.

The second mark of mission is to teach, baptise and nurture new believers. This happens through sermons; we have baptised more than 15 children and adults already this year. We have several new attendees both at church and at Messy Church.

The third mark of mission is "To respond to human need by loving service". We continue to work with St Peter's Askern and the food bank 'Cry'. We take foodstuff into Campsall on Thursdays between 5.30pm and 6.30pm and before our 11am service on Sundays at Campsall.

The four mark of mission is "To transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation". Jesus's main message that comes across is Love, if we Love our neighbour, our community, and the Earth, then we are heading in the right direction. However, sometimes we may need to speak out about injustice and violence; we had a Saturday coffee morning earlier in the year and fundraised for the Ukraine and we continue to pray for them.

*God of peace and justice,

to guide their decisions.
Above all, we pray for all your precious children,
at risk and in fear,
that you would hold and protect them.
We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.*



Campsall Bell Ringers


We are happy to announce the start of Campsall bell ringing practice weekly sessions on Monday evenings at St Mary Magdalene Church. If you are interested in

The work on the roof at St Helen's Church Burghwallis continues. Hopefully, this will mean the church will soon be open for services, meetings, and visitors. We will let you know when we know the opening date and invite people to come a look

at the work and for use to meet with you.



Both Burghwallis and Campsall churches are now registered with A Rocha and we are making good progress towards their bronze awards, with the help of two experience volunteers and the support of the probation service.



This will include the starting of a 'Messy Church Goes Wild' for children with their parents who wish to learn more about nature and wildlife, with the aim to develop our churchyards and beyond.

Our hope in September is to link up St Peter's Askern St Helen's Burghwallis and St Mary Magdalene Campsall and Sutton, to create a Mission area Messy Church 'Goes Wild' group. The first Mission area activity will be at St Peter's Askern. This is open to any children (accompanied by an adult) from the areas above. This will develop across all the villages. If you have a child or grandchild who you would like to join, please contact me so I can send you a form.



Fr Chris has been working with CMA Bentley, who are linked to St Peter's Church Bentley, with regards to supporting our communities as a volunteer debt adviser. Fr Chris has completed Level's 1 and 2 and has passed his exam, to become a Debt Adviser.

He now is available to talk and offer support to those in Burghwallis, Campsall, Norton and Sutton. Those who wish support, please contact CMA centre in Bentley. Fr Chris will aim to be available one Friday a month, working from CMA Bentley.



Hospitality

We will be developing hospitality further in 2022, with a few small changes in St May Magdalene church, to welcome people with a drink before and after services, maybe even a bit of toast etc. As it would be lovely to get to know more of you and learn what the church can do for you.

We also still have eyes for both churches to be more community focused and central to our communities. May I ask you for ideas of how we can do this. We can and will offer God's churches for community projects and support groups.

We especially wish to look at opening:

A Natter Church, a place for people of retirement age to have a chat together in church. We are looking at purchasing some coffee machines to aid with refreshments. If anyone wishes to support a community drop in, on a day which doesn't clash with any other similar community groups please let me know, we aim to add to services already available, or offer a space to those who need it.

Dementia Café, We are praying for the opportunity to support, both those living with Dementia and their supporters. **Anyone** who has knowledge of such groups who would give advice, lead, co-lead, support please contact me personally, or leave a message on my answer phone.

A Holy Communion service will be held at 11.00 am each Sunday at St Mary Magdalene Church, Campsall.


Also, the service will be live via St Mary Magdalene and St Helen's church Facebook pages. Plus, a recording of the service will be available for distribution via e-mail afterwards.



THREW THEM IN THE AIR!




THE FARMER HOPED THEY WOULD TAKE ROOT JUST





ANOTHER - 'YOUR VERY GOOD HEALTH' RECEIPE – ENJOY!

Chicken Breasts Italian Style


2 chicken breast fillets
Garlic salt
1 tablespoon tomato puree
4oz. Mozzarella cheese
½oz. seasoned flour
1 beaten egg
4oz. wholemeal breadcrumbs
4oz. butter for frying



1. With a sharp knife split the fillets, sprinkle with the garlic salt. Spread the fillets with the tomato puree. Slice the cheese and tuck into the slits. Dip in seasoned flour, then dip in the beaten egg and coat with the breadcrumbs.
2. Heat the butter in a large frying pan and fry each side to seal the breadcrumbs. Transfer to an ovenproof serving dish and bake at 400°F (200°C, Gas Mark 6) for 20 minutes.

Serve with fresh vegetables and new potatoes.

A short story from the Bible


It can be read in the Bible in Genesis chapter 6:9 to 9:17.

Everywhere God looked, people were hurting others, fighting, lying, cheating and stealing. Only Noah was good.


I'm going to send a flood to get rid of the bad people




You must build a big life raft

All the animals, all the food and all Noah's family were packed on board...




...and God closed the door.

The rain began to fall




for 40 days and nights




but the life raft floated.
