






Campsall Bell Ringers

Discussions have started to link St Peter's Askern St Helen's Burghwallis and St Mary Magdalene Campsall and Sutton, to create a Mission area Messy Church 'Goes Wild' group. The next 'Messy Wild' will be in spring 2023.

We also still have eyes for both churches to be more community focused and central to our communities. May I ask you for ideas of how we can do this. We can and will offer God's churches for community projects and support groups.

We especially wish to look at opening:

A Natter Church, a place for people of retirement age to have a chat together in church. We are looking at purchasing some coffee machines to aid with refreshments. If anyone wishes to support a community drop in, on a day which doesn't clash with any other similar community groups please let me know, we aim to add to services already available, or offer a space to those who need it. We are still praying for people to come

forward from the community to help support and launch this community project.

Dementia Café, We are praying for the opportunity to support, both those living with Dementia and their supporters. **Anyone** who has knowledge of such groups who would give advice, lead, co-lead, support please contact me personally, or leave a message on my answer phone.






A short story from the Bible

People came to John to be baptised-washed in the river Jordan-to say sorry for what they had done wrong. Then Jesus came...







OUR BURGHWALLIS

As a council our village is our number one priority. With this in mind, we are hoping for your help with improving the appearance of the village and the way it is used by residents.

Our Highways – are in terrible condition and although we as a council are requesting assistance from DMBC, we would ask for your support in doing so also. Please report any potholes or issues you see in our village, the voice of many is more powerful than the voice of one.

Traffic – is an issue in our village due to us being a connection between towns, unfortunately it's apparent that not all motorists appreciate that our village has a 30mph. This is something we are working towards for a solution, we are doing our best and ask for your support with this.

Parking – is also becoming more of an issue, please ask visitors to leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow pushchairs and wheelchair access. Also being considerate on narrow lanes not to block roads for emergency vehicles.

The Village Playing field – The children's play area is regularly inspected and maintained. The field is also cut and looked after regularly. We also have a compost bin for anyone wishing to use it.

Noticeboard – within the village we have a Parish Council noticeboard, if you have a charity event, volunteer project or other such item which you would like to display on the notice board, please contact Dave Maxwell.
