Home Group. Come and join us, have a warm drink and biscuits as we look deeper into scripture and Christian life, meeting in my home in Norton.





We also still have eyes for both churches to be more community focused and central to our communities. May I ask you for ideas of how we can do this. We can and will offer God's churches for community projects and support groups. We especially wish to look at opening:

A Natter Church, a place for people of retirement age to have a chat together in church. We are looking at purchasing some coffee machines to aid with refreshments. If anyone wishes to support a community drop in, on a day which doesn't clash with any other similar community groups please let me know, we aim to add to services already available, or offer a space to those who need it. We now have several people who are willing to support, therefore we will soon be starting this wonderful, relax event.

Dementia Café, We are now moving closer to opening a dementia café on a Saturday for a chance for people to come, have a drink and chat and listen to, or sing along to some well-known songs from WW2, the Beatles and many more.

Others cut palm branches and




They shouted the traditional welcome to the Passover feast

The teachers of the laws were angry







Bus service through Burghwallis

As many of our long-term residents will know, we went through a prolonged period in the 1990's and 2000's without a bus service through the village. Eventually, as a result of continued pressure from the PC, and others, Doncaster Corporation and then First Bus provided a service from Doncaster to Askern, through Burghwallis. Last year, First Bus advised that they cease operating that service and we were faced with the prospect of no buses, again. However, our fears were not realised, as Arriva decided to provide a service through the village, and, in fact, a better service in terms of extended hours of operating, including a Sunday service.
