Letter from Fr Chris

June 2023

May was a wonderful month for many, especially all the celebrations following the coronation of King Charles the Third, who also takes over as the head of the Church of England. The King continues the Royal line. At the start of June, the first Sunday is 'Trinity Sunday'. A reminder of the 'King of Kings' that we see in God. In God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The 'Holy Trinity'. The first time I came across the term 'Holy Trinity' was when I trained as a chef, many moons ago. The name was given to a 'mirepoix' (French) or 'sofrito' (Italian). I was taught the importance of the three vegetables, onion, carrot, and celery. 
1st Sunday of the month (unsung Eucharist) 8am,

Dementia Café, We are now moving closer to opening a dementia café on a Saturday for a chance for people to come, have a drink and chat and listen to, or sing along to some well-known WW2 songs, the Beatles and many more.



ASKERN FOOD BANK

Askern Foodbank, also known as CRY (Community Reaching You), serves Askern and surrounding villages.

The Foodbank has been operating for more than seven years. Currently there are nine volunteers, (including myself) responsible for collecting and ordering food items, storing them and distributing either by client collection or when necessary, by home delivery. The Foodbank is located at St Peter's Church Hall, Askern, opposite the Co-op.

The Foodbank is open to clients to attend on Thursday mornings between 10.30 am and 12 midday. Clients are welcome to sit and talk whilst being offered drinks and snacks. In cases of emergency, via referrals, food parcels are accessed throughout the week with support of team members.

The team are most grateful for the generous donations from the community especially via our local churches such as Burghwallis and Campsall. The Co-op and Asda also supply food, toiletries, and vital cash donations. Doncaster Council provide a substantial part of the Foodbank's income.

At the Foodbank, the team work closely with workers from The Stronger Communities Team (Doncaster Council). These workers work alongside clients to identify those in financial crisis and support them to access any unclaimed benefits and develop greater awareness of personal financial management in these difficult times.

In the last twelve months demand for support from the Foodbank has tripled.

Though we have all experienced food/fuel inflation, of course those who are most financially in need have felt this most significantly. Currently need is beginning to outstrip supply. Further funding streams are continually being sought as there is no end in sight to the current cost of living crisis.

(As you aren't paying me wages, can I have) the black sheep? J




Laban agreed, but that day he moved all the black sheep far away

Your father doesn't like me any more. We need to go back


