


Burghwallis Services:

# Glamorgan Sausages - Something different for January!

# Ingredients:

50oz fresh breadcrumbs 1 small (finely chopped) leek.

30z Caerphilly cheese (grated) 1 tbsp. chopped parsley.

Salt & pepper 2 eggs and 1 egg yolk, reserve white

Pinch of dry mustard A little milk (too dry)

# Method:

1. Mix together and form into 12 sausages – Toss in flour.

2. Coat in beaten egg white and breadcrumbs and chill for 20 minutes.

3. Fry gently in oil until crisp.

Serve with a good chutney as part of snack or mail meal with crispy fries – Enjoy.

And only seldom scream!


So, when the season's over,

In Egypt the Hebrew people flourished so well that the new Pharaoh grew scared and ordered all their new born boys to be killed.






She made a basket from reeds for him and put it in the grass by the river Nile.
