

Firstly, we feel we must mention and big thank you to everyone who has contributed so far to our Restoration Fund either, when visiting the church or online, we are very grateful.

However great or small the contribution is it all helps to boost our funds which will form part of any grant funding which will be applied for in the coming months.

As we go through 2025, and how the months are passing, we are keeping our fingers crossed that the very aged boiler 'fires up' when the autumn and winter months are upon us! The risk of this failing us becomes an even greater worry to both the PCC and the wardens here at Campsall.

On 24th June PCC members and I met with the Diocese Advisory Committee, Architects and other church advisors to look at both the extent of the roof condition and our heating issue. The meeting was intensive and hopefully the outcome is a better understanding by those at the meeting just what

challenges lay ahead and how to manage the grant funding and fund raising in the coming months and years ahead.

We have a long journey ahead, but this journey has begun and let's hope and pray that this beautiful, historic Grade 1 listed church will be an inviting, dry, warm building for the community, to use in many years to come when we achieve our goal to restore St Mary Magdalene.


She picked a field, asked if she could glean, then worked
